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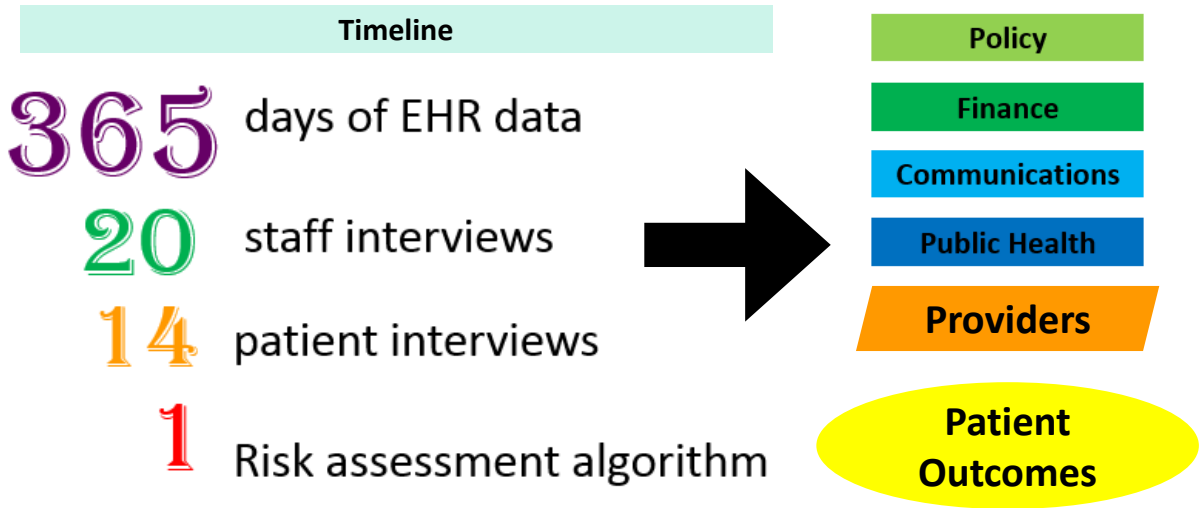

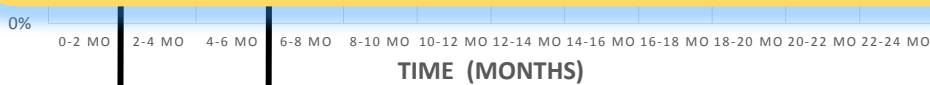

## Results: Eisner Infant Feeding Trends from 0-24 months

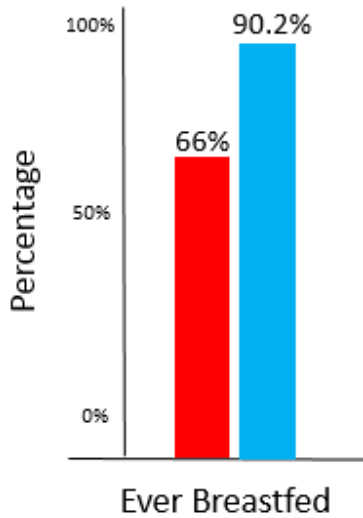
What factors are driving the transition to exclusive bottle feeding during the first 6 months?

## How do Eisner Breastfeeding Rates Compare to California?

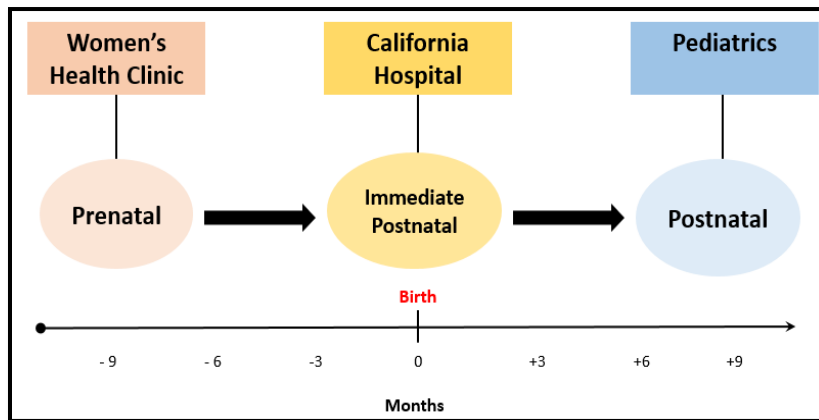
Exclusive Breastfeeding Rates at 3 & 6 Months

Eisner has the resources needed to support the technical and behavioral change education patients need to maintain exclusive breastfeeding through 6-months.

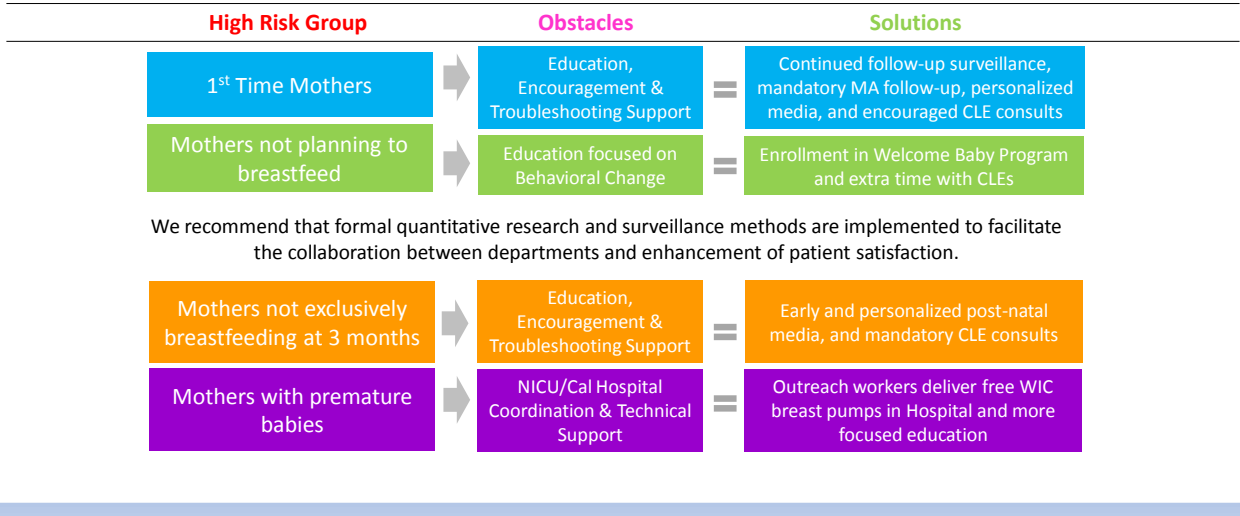
## The Intervention: Organizational Accountability Will Improve Patient Outcomes



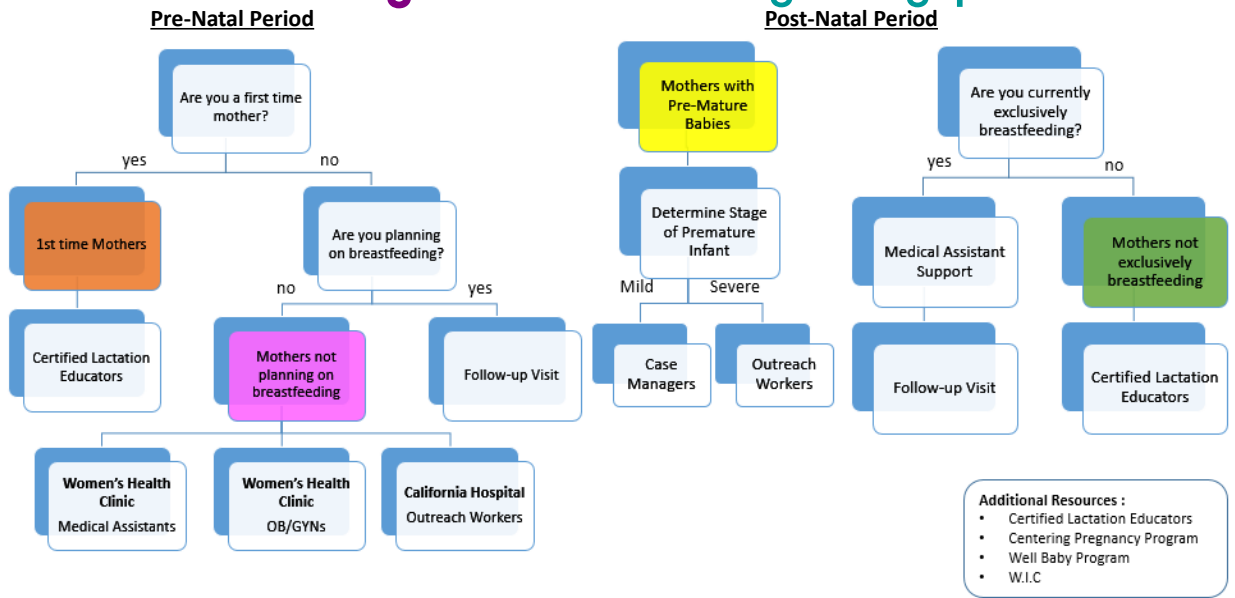
Patient Flow • Resource Type • Risk Evaluation

# Strategies: Implementing a solution

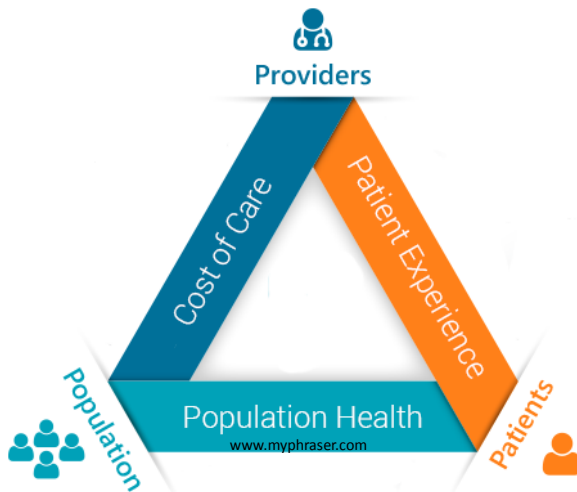
Our research outlined 4 high risk groups that need time-specific and personalized lactation education resources. Targeting these groups will provide Eisner with key patient-specific parameters to evaluate resource efficacy and patient outcomes.
